Luke Randall, 40, painter

If you travel west ten miles across Narragansett Bay, you'll come to the tiny town of North Kingstown and the historic Shady Lea Mill, a century-old retired textile mill that has now been converted into, among other things, an enclave of sculptors and painters. Luke Randall is one of them, using his studio (pictured) to paint portraits and landscapes.
